BREXIT

I am disappointed that the UK's departure from the EU has been, provisionally, delayed until October. I will always remain true to my manifesto commitments and, whatever proposal comes forward, I will oppose it if it does not take us out of the Customs Union and Single Market. I will also vote against a Second Referendum, and any further delays to our exit.

Regrettably, some of my colleagues, even those who campaigned on the same manifesto I did, do not see it this way and have successfully frustrated our withdrawal. I have no power to compel or instruct any other Member how to vote and can only account for my own actions at this time.
